



The Rettig Fellowship 2024

The purpose of the program

The Royal Swedish Academy of History, Letters and Antiquities is pleased to offer Short-Term Research Fellowships to support PhD students and young scholars engaged in post-doctoral research in the Academy's field of activity. The fellowship is intended to support projects that use the special collections on-site at the archive and library of the Swedish National Heritage Board (terms specified below).

The aim of the scholarship program is to facilitate use of the collections at the archive and library of the Swedish National Heritage Board. During the application period two digital briefings will be held, which will provide an overview of the collections at the Swedish National Heritage Board, with room for Q & A. Eligibility and selection criteria

PhD students and young postdoctoral researchers pursuing research relating to the Academy's field of activity, i.e. the humanities, the social sciences, and cultural environment care, are welcome to apply. Two stipends will be awarded at this time, one to a male scholar and one to a female scholar, all in accordance with the donors' wills.

The selection committee will consider:

- the demonstrated need to consult specific items or collections at the archive and library of the Swedish National Heritage Board
- the novelty of the proposed project

The stipend

The stipend consists of a one-time amount of SEK 100,000. It is not possible to apply for further allowance for accommodation, travels etc. Please note: The scholarship does not



include health care insurance or other benefits. Stipends may be subject to taxation. Consult your local tax authority for advice.

Key Dates

Applications must be submitted by 1 November 2024. Late applications will not be considered. Applicants will be notified on 20 November 2024.

The funds need to be requisitioned no later than 31 December 2025. The same deadline applies to the submission of the project report, and the mandatory research output must be completed, or scheduled, by the same date at the latest (details below).

Application

The application must consist of the following two parts:

- project proposal, not exceeding 1,500 words
- abbreviated CV of no more than two pages

The project proposal needs to include a general description of the research project, its title and format, and the applicant's contact details. Furthermore, it should demonstrate the significance of the research project in your field of study and explain how the collections at the Swedish National Heritage Board will contribute to the progress and completion of the research project. It should also include an indication of intended outputs, such as publication, exhibition, or presentation.

The application should be sent to ata@raa.se and bibl@raa.se and the subject heading marked "Rettig".

Terms of the fellowship awards

The stipends can only be awarded to individual scholars, not a research group or similar. Scholars who have already been awarded a Rettig Fellowship may apply again, on the condition that their previous project has been completed.

The research project must result in the publication of an article or the equivalent (grant application, compilation of database, conference paper or similar). The fellow is also invited to deliver a 30-minute public lecture at the Swedish National Heritage Board.

The fellow will submit a c. 1,000-word written report on the completion of their fellowship and a 150-word summary of the project and its outcomes. The texts may be published on the webpage of the Swedish National Heritage Board (and the Royal Swedish Academy of Letters, History and Antiquities).
